Society events and activities

A varied programme of talks and events are held throughout the year on topics relating to Bhutan. Since 2020, many of these have been done virtually but in 2022 we have some face-to-face events as well.

Recent events include: textiles in Bhutan, conservation and ecology, conservation work by the Courtauld in Bhutan, festivals and culture, trekking routes, and small businesses and enterprise.

Members receive the Society's Newsletter three times during the year.

The annual dinner is open to all members and their guests and to welcome Bhutanese in the UK.

The Society's website contains an archive of previous events, useful information about Bhutan (such as key dates in the calendar) and information about future events.
